

To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.





July 14, 2024

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 6:03

Pledge of Allegiance: led by President Richard Laird

Opening Prayer: led by Pat Lima

Richard Laird: This meeting is held in accordance with SRPW governing documents and Robert's Rules of Order – 12<sup>th</sup> Addition. This meeting is also being recorded and announced in the Sentinel, SRPW website and the clubhouse door.

**Roll Call**: President – Richard Laird: Vice President – Esther Perez; Secretary – Virginia Sansone; Treasurer – Mike Pelonero – absent, Mary Bethe McGill, Brian Kochera – absent; Bob Sellitto; Shirley Emmons; Tom Kalinowski – absent; John Feegan – absent; no quorum available.

**Richard Laird President's report:** We don't have a quorum for tonight's meeting. What we'll do is go over some basic stuff. We would need a motion tonight to accept the May and June minutes that will have to be put off till August. Governor Murphy has issued a mandate that we no longer have to publish minutes or publish meeting attendance in newspapers. All we need to do now is post it on the front door, in the Sentinel and on our website.

I'd like to introduce Bob Sellitto. He's our new section eight trustee. Thank you for stepping up. We do have a new treasurer. Mike Pelonero is helping us out part time. Jim has been working with him at the same time to make sure the transition is as smooth as possible. Jim, I want to thank you for that.

We have brought on a new law firm to work with us. The group is Wilentz, Goldman and Spitzer. This group works hand in hand with the engineering group that we have now.

One of the things we're going to do is start up the recreation committee again. It'll be something that we can start opening recreation to our association and look into getting the backyard straightened out for the game's outback.

We are going to fix all the benches in the association. There are 14 benches. We had set aside in the reserve study for up to 10 benches for \$12,000. We cut that in half. Also, we are going to install the water cooler and the leak downstairs.

The trees have been put on hold for right now unless it is an emergency. We went over our budget last month by double.

One of our custodians has agreed once the weather breaks, we are going to have him start going out and cleaning up the courts. Picking up soda cans, bottles and paper. We didn't hire a landscaping co., we hired a lawn mowing company, so it is not their job to pick up garbage.

If there is a issue that you have, that something's not being done or a code violation you know of, there are plenty of forms that can be filled out and submitted to us.

**Esther Perez Vice President's report**: We've gotten 17 complaints so far from homes that have not been taking care of their lawns or letting weeds grown through, and a lot of that is coming through on the forms that you found in your sentinel. So, thank you for filling them out. Bob is the one that goes through the community and verifies all violations and if not, it goes into the second process. Fines are not made up but they are according to the by laws. We have started a hopa and an emergency contact committee

as many files are still empty. The Wrinkle review unfortunately canceled their August show due to participation. If you like to sing, dance or show off, let us know. I've called for many bids for cameras. ADT and vivid are the only two that got back to me, so we are going to go on it. They are going to install 8 cameras. I want to say that it will cost \$119 a month but it will be well worth it.

Virginia Sansone Secretary report: The publisher and I have been putting a lot of hours in to make a lot of changes and corrections. The deadline for anyone wanting to post in the Sentinel is the 10th of every month. On August 31st we are having our annual Labor Day Barbecue. Come and join us. We are also working on the website, SRPWEST.US. There are many forms for you to download, and we are trying to bring things up to date.

MaryBeth McGill I received a call from Eli Ct. regarding grass cutting and low limbs on the trees scratching cars.

Rich Laird: After we go through all the courts and evaluate them, I want to do what they call a commercial cut on all the trees. We'll see how much money we have left.

**Debi Tobia:** I started to write down a lot of property maintenance.

Bob Sellitto: I received a call from the office to check out Westbrook, but other than that all quiet

Shirley Emmons: There is a house on Carlisle with a fence on the side of the house.

Committee Reports: ADR: Rich Larid: Do people have to be formally trained to be on your committee and can they sit in and listen? Jim: Not formally but have an idea of what they are doing. They might be able to sit and listen but will double check.

Election Committee: Rich Laird: I've asked them to put a procedure in place for elections.

Neighborhood watch: Virginia Sansone: Received a call for dead deer. Nothing HOA or we can do. Call Animal Control.

Men's Club: Joe Murphy We have the River Lady Cruise this Thursday. Be in parking lot between 4 and 5:30.

Community Events: Virginia Sansone Upcoming event Christmas in July. Come join us.

Rich Laird: Any question from the residents.

No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.



#### PARKING ON LAWNS

Parking on your property, in other than the designated driveway area, is prohibited. Designated driveway means the area that is paved for the purpose of parking your vehicle. #### SANITATION

If you are going away, please ask a friend or neighbor to put it out for you. This is a Berkeley Township ordinance and violators may be fined by the Township.

#### **CLUBHOUSE PARKING**

Parking in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip is limited to members only. When an Association member plans to leave a car in the Clubhouse parking lot while away on a trip, the office must be advised and provided with dates of trip, license plate number, make of car and proof of insurance. All vehicles left in the parking lot must be parked in the parking spaces nearest Westbrook Drive. Non-association members are not permitted to leave their cars in the parking lot while away on a trip. This, of course, applies to trips only and does not apply to non-association members who are attending events at the Clubhouse.

#### **CLUBHOUSE USE**

The Clubhouse is available for use by sanctioned clubs and committees for their events and meetings. In order to reserve space for meetings or events, an authorized club or committee member must complete a written calendar request and present it to the Vice President by email or in person. The Berkeley Township EMS is a paid service and accepts, as full payment, the payment provided by your health insurance.

#### GARAGE/YARD SALES

Residents may hold garage or yard sales only within the confines of resident's own garage or driveway and are limited to two (2) per year. No "Garage Sale," or "Yard Sale," advertisements are to be posted on utility poles or township signs and all signs must be removed immediately after the event. Note: Before holding a garage or yard sale, you must register it with the Township Clerk's Office; this is a Berkeley Township ordinance.

#### EXTERIOR PROPERTY **IMPROVEMENT**

All changes to your property that are visible to the exterior must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association before work can commence. You will need Architectural Control approval before you can obtain Berkeley Township permits where permits are required. Please complete the appropriate forms for your project and submit them to Architectural Control through the office. You may present the forms in person or send them via email. You may obtain the forms by visiting the office or by going to our new website srpwest.us. You can find the forms and instructions for Architectural Control in the Forms/Resources section of the website.

#### PET OWNERSHIP - SRPWHOA REOUIREMENTS

Silver Ridge Park West Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, Article VIII (K): Dogs, cats and other household pets may be kept as long as they are not bred for a commercial purpose and are restricted to the homeowner's lot or living unit unless they are on a leash. Ownership of pets is subject to Berkeley Township ordinances. IN SRPW, A MAXIMUM OF THREE HOUSEHOLD PETS IS PERMITTED.

# PET OWNERSHIP AND WILDLIFE BERKELEY TOWNSHIP REQUIREMENTS Domestic pets

Berkeley Township requires the licensing of every dog and cat. The license period runs from January to January and must be renewed every year. There is a minimum \$25.00 fine for failure to license.

#### Dogs:

Dog owners are prohibited from allowing their dogs to soil any lawn or property of any person other than the person who owns or has custody of the dog.

Dog owners may not keep a dog that habitually barks, cries or howls between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am. Dog owners must keep a dog on a leash not more than 6 feet long.

A fine of \$500 can be assessed for violation of these provisions. Go to this link for more detail on the Berkeley Township requirements for dog ownership. https://ecode360.com/35651810

#### Cats:

Do not feed a stray cat unless you ensure that it is spayed/neutered and inoculated for rabies. The Township can assess fines up to \$500 for violation of this provision.

Your cat must remain on your property and may not cause a nuisance to other residents.

#### Wildlife:

Berkeley Township prohibits the feeding of wildlife, including geese and ducks. Birds are the only wildlife that homeowners can feed as long as proper bird feeders are used.

#### **CONCERNS OR QUESTIONS?**

Use the Question, Suggestion, Information Form contained in the Sentinel whenever you have a concern. You can mail it to the office or drop it in the door slot. Your concern will be addressed at a monthly open session of the Board of Trustees. If you need an immediate response, contact your section trustee. You will find that contact information on p. 3. If your trustee cannot answer your question, he or she will then bring your concern to the Board of Trustees at a monthly open session.

#### **Fire Pits**

Wood Fire Pit Requirements – As open burning of any kind without a permit is prohibited, commercially purchased fire pits for residential usage only, are permitted if the following requirements are satisfied. Total fuel area must be less than 36 inches in width, length or diameter and not more than 24 inches in height, the fire pit must have legs and is off the ground and the fire pit is covered with a mandatory ember/ spark screen. The ember/spark screen is required to be in place at all times during the usage of the fire pit. The location of the fire pit shall be away from all combustible materials. Fire pit usage is prohibited when the NJFFS has issued a "Red Flag Warning". The burning of paper, leaves or other waste vegetation is also prohibited. Any type of fire pit, commercial or homemade, not meeting the stated requirements is considered "Open Burning" and thereby prohibited from usage, unless a permit is applied for and issued.

Berkeley Township Holiday City, Holiday Heights, and Silver Ridge residents: We are pleased to announce delivery of your new trash & recycling cans for the Township's Automated Trash Program. The initial phase began earlier this month, and we anticipate the delivery of all cans will be completed by the end of August.

After September 15, 2025, we will begin accepting orders for the purchase of second cans if needed. The cost for an extra can is \$65. There is a maximum of two (2) trash cans and two (2) recycling cans per household.

Please begin utilizing the new trash (BURGUNDY) can and recycling (BLUE) can only after your old cans have been emptied. To discard your old cans, please leave them at the curb once you receive your new cans. They will be collected separately within a few days.

- • TRASH should be securely bagged and placed in the BURGUNDY can.
- • RECYCLING items must be placed loose (NO PLASTIC BAGS) in the BLUE can; cardboard must be flattened and placed in the BLUE can.
- • Items placed outside a can, besides, or on top of a can WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.
- • Place your can: in the street, against the curb, and with the lid facing out.
- • Place your can: at least four (4) feet from obstructions, including parked vehicles.
- • Place your can: no earlier than 4 PM the day before, and no later than 5:30 AM on the scheduled collection day.

Residents with disabilities: Please provide a doctor's note stating you are disabled to be added to our list for special assistance. A staff member will retrieve your can from the top of your driveway and return it after being emptied. For more information about this program, please contact Public Works at: 732-349-4616.

BULK TRASH: Residents will continue receiving unlimited bulk trash collections throughout the year but must first call 732-349-4616 to schedule the pickup. Bulk trash items should be placed in the street (and against the curb to avoid vehicle traffic) no earlier than 4 PM the day before, and no later than 5:30 AM on the scheduled collection day.

Please be advised that the Public Works department is receiving a high volume of calls. We kindly ask that you leave a message only if you will not be calling again. This allows our staff to properly monitor inquiries and respond to the residents in a timely manner.

We appreciate your support, patience, and cooperation as we make these changes to better serve the community.





# No More Blurry Images

Many people complain that their images are not as sharp as they'd like them to be. Several things could cause this, but the one I see most often is not holding the camera properly. This is especially true for the small point-and-shoot cameras that many of us use today.

To photograph with these cameras, you must look at the screen on the back of the camera rather than through a viewfinder (as with an SLR camera). You must hold the camera away from your face and body to give your eyes room to see the screen. This is not as steady as holding the camera against your face and looking through the viewfinder. While pressing the shutter button, people have a tendency to flex their wrists, which moves the camera and causes blur. It can



also lead to losing the top portion of your image and cutting off the tops of your subjects!

To rectify this, simply press the shutter as softly as possible and make certain you do not flex your wrists. For added stability, you may brace your elbows against your body.

A deduction of \$250 is available to those residents age 65 years of age or older, who have owned their homes since October first of the previous tax year, lived in the state for two years and whose income (excluding Social Security or other similar government pension) does not exceed \$10,000.
