

Dues Assessments

The fourth quarter payment from 2025 dues were due on October 1st. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the 1st of the next month if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Control Committee is a standing committee and operates under the guidance of the SRPW HOA By-Laws, Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, and Rules and Regulations.

According to Article V, Section 1 of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions: No building or other structure, fence, wall, swimming pool or any other structure, either of a permanent or temporary character, shall be erected, moved on, installed, commenced or maintained, upon the properties nor shall any exterior addition to or alteration be made to any existing building or structure unless the plans and specifications thereof, showing the nature, kind, shape, height, materials and location of same, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony, as to exterior design, and location of surrounding structures and topography, by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association which shall consist of either (1) The Board of Trustees of the Association, or (2) a committee composed of not less than three (3) persons appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Association.

Process by the Committee Members:

- 1. Provide HOA paperwork and assist homeowner with preparation of same.
- 2. Do preliminary site survey and discuss with homeowner planned improvements.
- 3. Collect homeowner's completed paperwork.
- 4. Present paperwork to HOA officers for approval and be available to discuss with officers.
- 5. Collect officer's signatures for approval.
- 6. Provide homeowner with copies of approval to proceed.
- 7. Maintain contact with homeowner.
- 8. Resident to contact Architectural Control upon completion of job Review project upon completion.
- 9. Return completed paperwork to HOA office for the permanent files.
- 10. Maintain tracking worksheet with progress.

Violations of the HOA Covenants and Restrictions:

- 1. STOP WORK order to cease work in progress
- 2. Delay in approval of proposed work
- 3. Possible non-approval of proposed work
- 4. Fines by the HOA for non-compliance, not to exceed \$100 per violation
- 5. Fines by Berkeley Township for code violations


Don't be shy. Let us fill our clubhouse with residents that are concerned about our community.

Meeting minutes

September 14, 2025

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by President Richard Laird

Richard Laird: Let's have a moment of silence for the victims of 911.

Richard Laird: This meeting is held in accordance with SRPW governing documents and Robert's Rules of Order – 12th Addition. This meeting is also being digitally transcribed and announced in the Sentinel, SRPW website and the clubhouse door.

Roll Call: President – Richard Laird; Vice President – Esther Perez; Secretary – Virginia Sansone; Treasurer – Mike Pelonero – absent; Mary Bethe McGill; Brian Kochera-Absent; Bob Sellitto; Shirleyane Emmons; Tom Kalinowski; John Fegan; we have a quorum.

All board members & trustee approved the minutes for August.

Richard Laird President's report: In order for a quorum, we must have 40 residents check in. We are going to have the election committee start signing in our residents.

There will be a meet and greet, totally informal setting. No records, no recordings on September 13th, 2025, from 12 pm to 2 pm. This is for the trustees and the board to meet the residents.

We are looking to increase the hall rental to \$250 for the residents. All in favor - 7 agreed – Section 10 disagreed. The new Hall rental will now be \$250.

Let me touch on the Event Club. The Event Club was using the Clubhouse EIN number, and they shouldn't have it according to the lawyers. They were told to get their own EIN number in which they did and now call themselves Community Events. The money that was transferred from the account was money that they earned. The seed money that was given to them was returned to the HOA in the amount of \$2000.

Debi Tobia: Can the clubhouse open at 12:15 pm on Tuesdays so that the yoga class has a chance to pack up their things before the pool players come in.

Richard Laird: All in favor of the downstairs opening at 12:30 pm on Tuesdays. All in favor - 7

approved and 1 disapproved.

By law change explained by Richard Laird. The reason for the residents not being able to vote yes or no, is because it is not in the By-Laws for residents' votes.

Esther Perez: Common grounds – We have been cleaning up where branches are down. We meet every Saturday morning between the hours of 8 am and 9 am if you would like to join us.

Bob Sellitto: Many complaints are coming in about homes and residents.

John Fegan: There are a couple of meetings that will be held during the daytime hours. What happens to the trustee that calls out as they have normal jobs.

Richard Laird: It will not count against you if you don't come to the daytime meeting if you work a full-time job.

Financials – All in favor

Marybeth McGill – Section 5: Resident on Ely Ct. called regarding the robo cans and asking what if they can not handle them due to medical reasons. Also, what if they get damaged.

Richard Laird: If there is a medical reason, they can have their doctors send a script to the sanitation department and they will make arrangements to pull them to the street for you and return them. If the cans are damaged, they will replace them.

Section 7, 8, 9.10 and 11 all quiet.

Architectural Control: Nothing new

ADR: Jim Egan: There is a new process for ADR. All representatives will be attending a education program per the DCA.

Common ground: Nothing new

Compliance: 3 new home buyers this month

Election Committee: A process is being put together.

Food Bank: Vivian: Food is low, and we need help.

Property Tax Deductions

A deduction of \$250 is available to those residents age 65 years of age or older, who have owned their homes since October first of the previous tax year, lived in the state for two years and whose income (excluding Social Security or other similar government pension) does not exceed \$10,000.
