

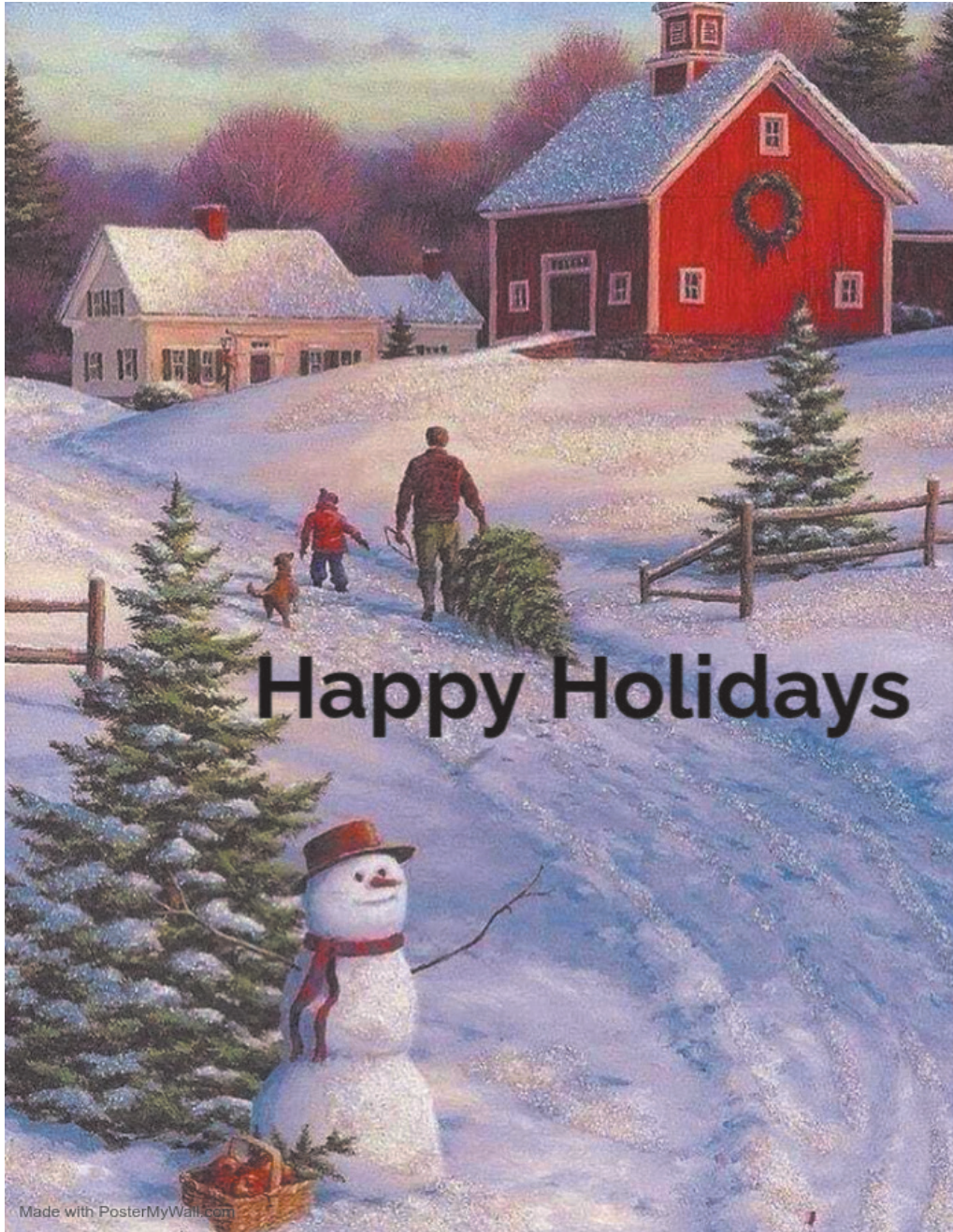

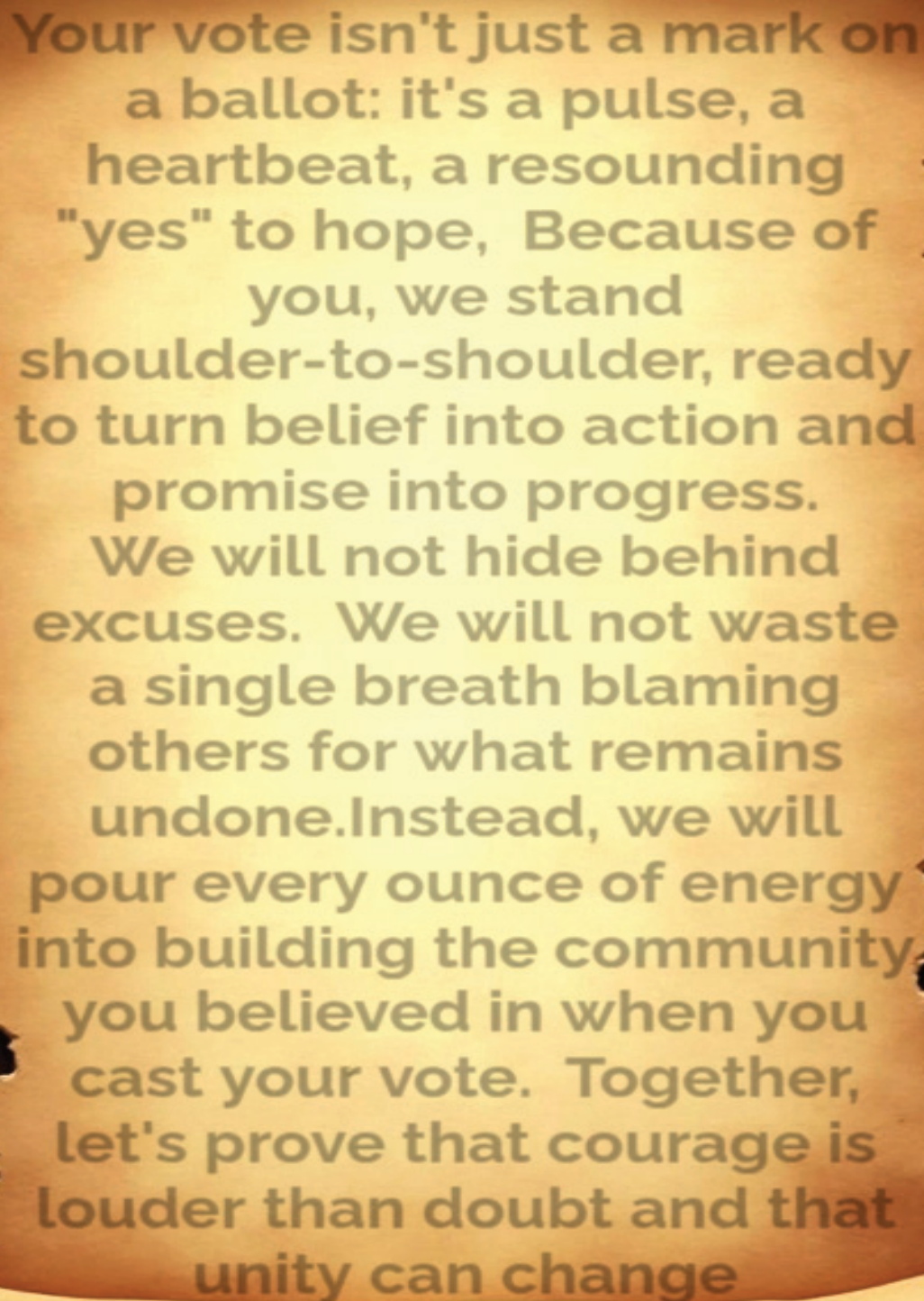

Dues Assessments

The first-quarter dues payment of 2026 are due on January 1st. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the 1st of the next month if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. **Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.**

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

Christmas Tree Safety



As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.



After Christmas

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- ! **Almost one third** of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- ! Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- ! A heat source too close to the tree causes more than **one in every five** of the fires.

Meeting minutes

October 13, 2025

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by President Richard Laird

Richard Laird: Pat Lima for the Prayer

Roll Call: President – Richard Laird; Vice President – Esther Perez; Secretary – Virginia Sansone; Treasurer – Mike Pelonero – absent; Mary Beth McGill - absent; Brian Kochera-Absent; Bob Sellitto - absent; Shirleyane Emmons; Tom Kalinowski; John Fegan; we have a quorum.

President Richard Laird: We have a Quorum. This meeting is held in accordance with SRPW governing documents and Robert's Rules of Order – 12th Edition. This meeting is also being digitally transcribed and announced in the Sentinel, posted on the SRPW website and clubhouse door.

All Board Officers & Trustees approved the minutes for September.

Richard Laird President's report: I want to follow up on Community Events, as there has been a lot of misinformation placed out there on social media. There's been rumors, lies and misinformation spread around, and false accusations thrown out here on the floor. We now have a resident who filed a police report that \$13,000 was stolen from this community. They were authorized signers on the account and most of it would have been turned over to them anyway. Just like I reported at the last two meetings that the money was transferred from one account to the next account. They were told to get their own EIN by the past treasurer, and I was sitting in the meeting. If he/she went out and blatantly knew the money was not stolen and filed false police report it is against the law. There will be no question in this regard. This is something that will be moving forward, it is not open to discussion. That is all I can say on that, I cannot answer any questions. Those on social media can do whatever they want to do, but I would be careful as the police officers have screen shots of social media Thank you.

As far as the by-law amendments that went out, they were approved. We had 62 rejection ballots returned. We need 115 to overturn the amendments to

the by-laws. So, if anyone wants to come in to count the ballots, come on in and we will let you count them.

One of the things that was brought up, I was under the impression when we did the grass contract, they also did a snow contract and that did not happen. The previous contractor is no longer in business. We had two contracts that came in. Neither contract requires us to put down a deposit

Regarding insurance. I know there are a lot of scuttlebutts out there about how I am changing everything. Nobody had to have insurance as they didn't have to have it in the past. They always have had to have it. I specifically ask our insurance and his name is Chris. It is no different if a catering company comes in here, a DJ comes in here, if a resident rents the hall, they must be insured. So, the parties must have insurance and that is right from our insurance representative. Without their own insurance, the Association could and most likely would be liable in any legal action.

Secondly, the last thing I want to talk about is proper decorum at these meetings and it hasn't been followed. I was going to shut it down tonight so that the residents couldn't talk. If you want to talk, raise your hand, be recognized, no more sneering, jeering and cheering from the back of the room. Because you will be shut down and asked to leave. I did agree with the board members to give it one more shot, Thank you.

Vice President Esther Perez: Anchor program you only have till the 31st. You must file every year. If you need to call, the number is 888-238-1233.

The office is continually getting dead animal calls. Do me a favor and call the township

We are going to be updating the common ground sheet that is in the Sentinel. Please folks, I need your email and your phone numbers on that too. Going forward, we need emails, which is the way of the future. We need to be more aware of what's going on around us. We had 19 code violations, 14 which have been addressed.

Ground maintenance is typically Jim, John and I but we are done until the spring.

Richard Laird: According to our rules and regulations the garden fence is supposed to come down November 1st. We need to take a vote on that to delay till the next meeting to give the board an opportunity to redo the Rules and Regulations for the next meeting. There are several individuals that want to leave the fencing up year-round. There would have to be a clear definition of that because everyone has a different type of fence.

All approved the motion

Homeowners meeting is at 3:00 on November 10th just as a reminder.

Secretary Virginia Sansone: In regard to the Sentinel and Website, we want to apologize for the mistakes that have been in there. We had a meeting with the publisher last week and were told that they hired a new girl that has never done this before. There were a lot of things that were missing and a lot of things she did not do and we want you to know it was not us. . We do have people proof reading. No matter what we said, this girl was not putting it in the Sentinel the way it should be.

Richard Laird: Because cornhole was so popular at the BBQ, we bought 2 sets and we have them here. They will be set up when spring comes, so if anyone wants to play next year, they will be up.

Treasurer Report: What was posted in the Sentinel about the balance sheets is whatever they came up with. It is nothing that was ever printed out of this building. No documents ever come up with 2024-2025 information and I have no idea, and they have no idea how it happened. So, you have the September financials, we brought in for the month \$27857.00 expenditure were \$18,000 which gave us a profit of \$3250.00, so we are staying ahead of the game.

I need a motion to approve the financials. Unanimous.

Now for Trustee reports:

Brian Kochera: I received a call from a resident that was to repair their deck and wanted to know if she had to go through Architectural Control and get a permit. She said it is only two boards

Richard Laird: No, she does not

Debi Tobia: My very first call from a new resident to see when the landscapers are coming around. I informed her we don't do that, and she must get her own.

Shirleyan Emmons: All quiet

Tom Kalinowski: All quiet

John Fegan: All quiet

Richard Laird: Committee reports

Architectural Control: Jim not present... We had a resident that had 2 sheds on the property because of a tree that was planted as a memorial, but after talking to the resident, the shed is where it belongs. So that was taken care of.

ADR: Jim Egan: Richard Laird said he had one more for them.

Common ground: Nothing new

Compliance: Esther Perez: We do compliance three weeks before closing and the title co. contacts us 1 week before . We have two houses that are close back-to-back.

Richard Laird: One thing on the one-time purchase fee, being that our reserve account was over \$250,000 a lot of the money was going into our R&R account, so it is probably \$30,000 over in our R&R, that is why it looks so high. We are going to be opening a second R&R account and move the money back there. Reserve account is for the reserve study in case something happens to the building, or repairs need to be done

Election Committee: Everything is going great.

Food Bank: Vivian: Richard Laird reported: Food is low, and we need help.

Health & Welfare: Virginia Sansone reported: HC Neighborhood Pharmacy will be here October 25, 2025, to give flu shots.

Neighborhood Watch: Virginia Sansone: We had scheduled another Town Hall Meeting for December 2, 2025 at 7 pm.

Recreation: Nothing new

Trex Bench Program: Vicki Kohanek: Campaign two is from September 2025 to September 2026. We have already delivered 500 lbs. of plastic for the second campaign.

Club reports:

Women's club: Denise Kalinowski: Next meeting will be November 5 at 1:00 pm and a light lunch will be served. This Saturday will be our Oktoberfest.

Men's club: Tom Kalinowski: Our next meeting is this Wednesday at 1:00 pm. Next week we have our Atlantic City Trip on Thursday the 23rd. We have 7 tickets left if anyone wants to buy them.

Community Events: Virginia Sansone: Tricky Tray November 9th, 2025. Tickets are still available.

Tai Chi: Vicki Kohanek: Wednesday evenings at 6:15. \$7 per week and \$20 per month

Richard Laird: We will open it up to the floor now for our homeowners.

Jim Eagan: We have our pancake breakfast on the first Thursday of the month November 6th. Thank you to the Men's Club and we will have our meeting after that.

Resident: Can you explain to me I know what the men's club and women's club are the same but what does the Event Club do? I bought my tickets thinking the money goes to the HOA but apparently it does not. Can you explain to me what the money is for and for what are they raising the money for?

Resident: Do you think it is still necessary to have an Event Club.

Richard Laird: The Event Club is a separated entity and so is the women's and mens club and we don't question anything from either one of those either.

Meeting adjourned at 6:58 pm





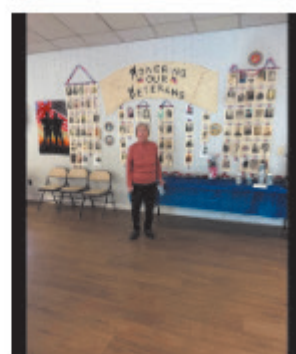

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Control Committee is a standing committee and operates under the guidance of the SRPW HOA By-Laws, Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, and Rules and Regulations.

According to Article V, Section 1 of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions: No building or other structure, fence, wall, swimming pool or any other structure, either of a permanent or temporary character, shall be erected, moved on, installed, commenced or maintained , upon the properties nor shall any exterior addition to or alteration be made to any existing building or structure unless the plans and specifications thereof, showing the nature, kind, shape, height, materials and location of same, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony, as to exterior design, and location of surrounding structures and topography, by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association which shall consist of either (1) The Board of Trustees of the Association, or (2) a committee composed of not less than three (3) persons appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Association.

Process by the Committee Members:

1. Provide HOA paperwork and assist homeowner with preparation of same.
2. Do preliminary site survey and discuss with homeowner planned improvements.
3. Collect homeowner's completed paperwork.
4. Present paperwork to HOA officers for approval and be available to discuss with officers.
5. Collect officer's signatures for approval.
6. Provide homeowner with copies of approval to proceed.
7. Maintain contact with homeowner.
8. Resident to contact Architectural Control upon completion of job Review project upon completion.
9. Return completed paperwork to HOA office for the permanent files.
10. Maintain tracking worksheet with progress.

Violations of the HOA Covenants and Restrictions:

1. STOP WORK order to cease work in progress
2. Delay in approval of proposed work
3. Possible non-approval of proposed work
4. Fines by the HOA for non-compliance, not to exceed \$100 per violation
5. Fines by Berkeley Township for code violations

Berkeley Township Construction Permits

No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.

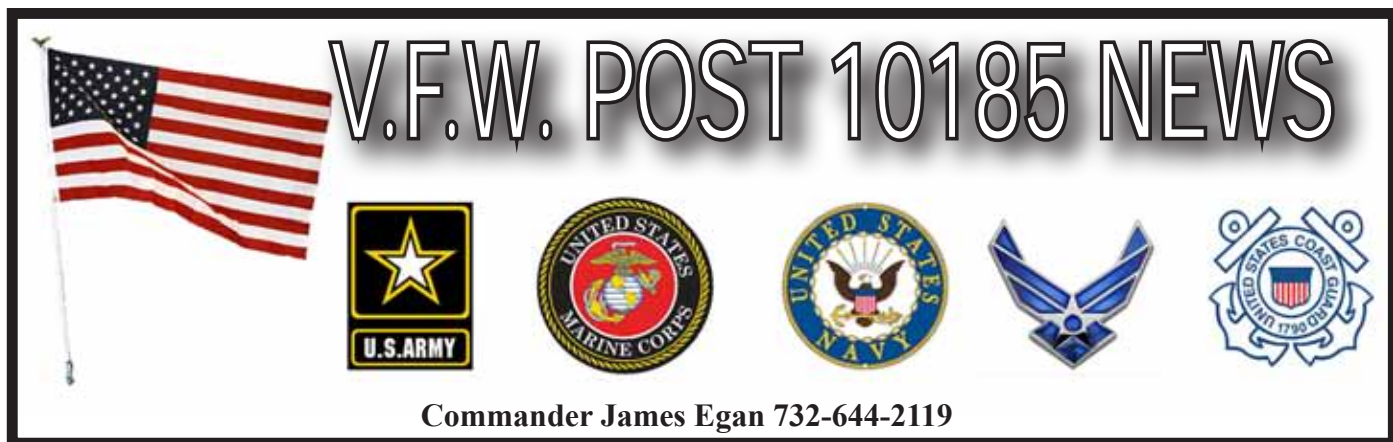

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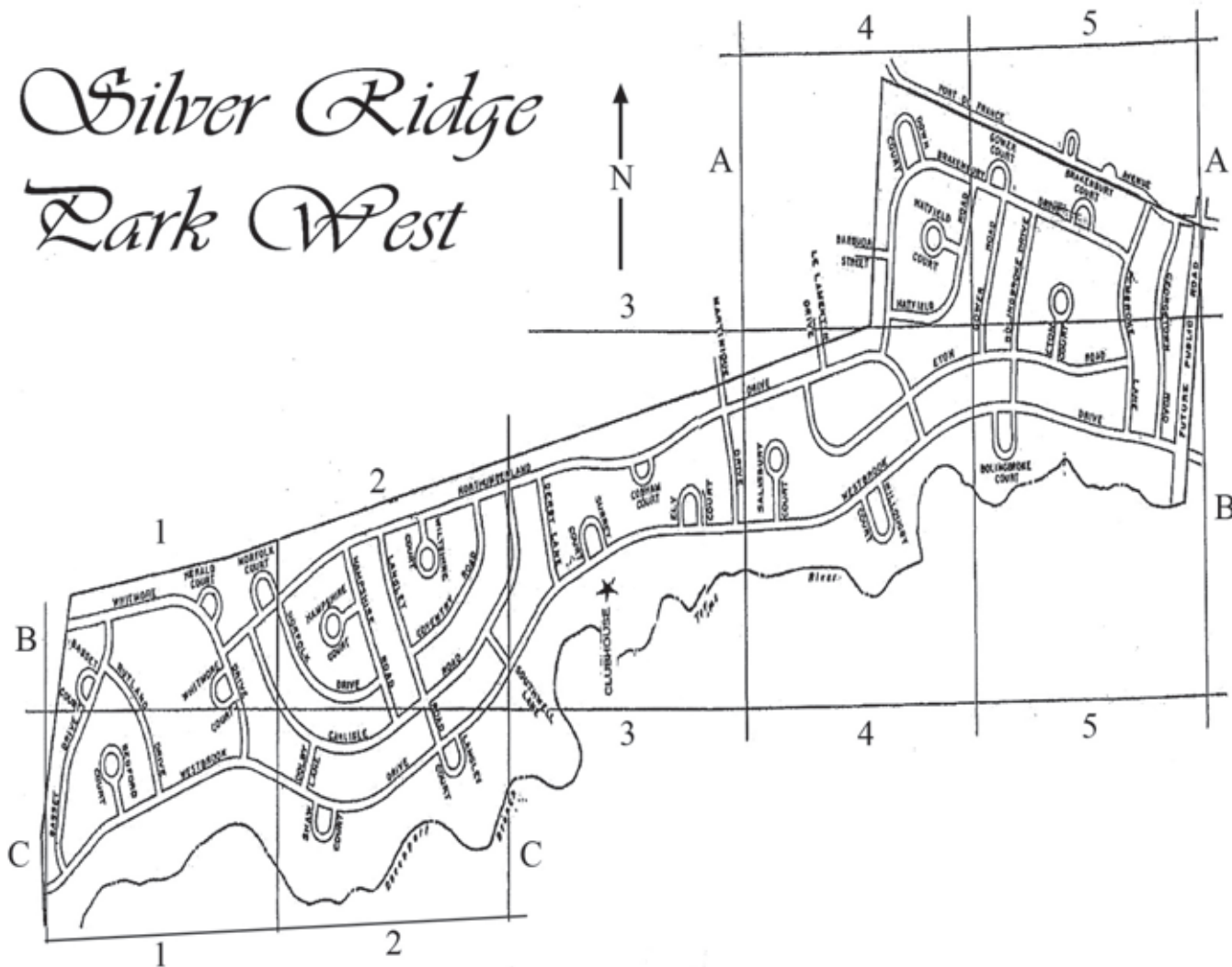

Make sure your tree is **at least 3 feet away** from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, space heaters, candles or heat vents. Also, make sure your tree does not block exits.



Get rid of your tree after Christmas or when it is dry.

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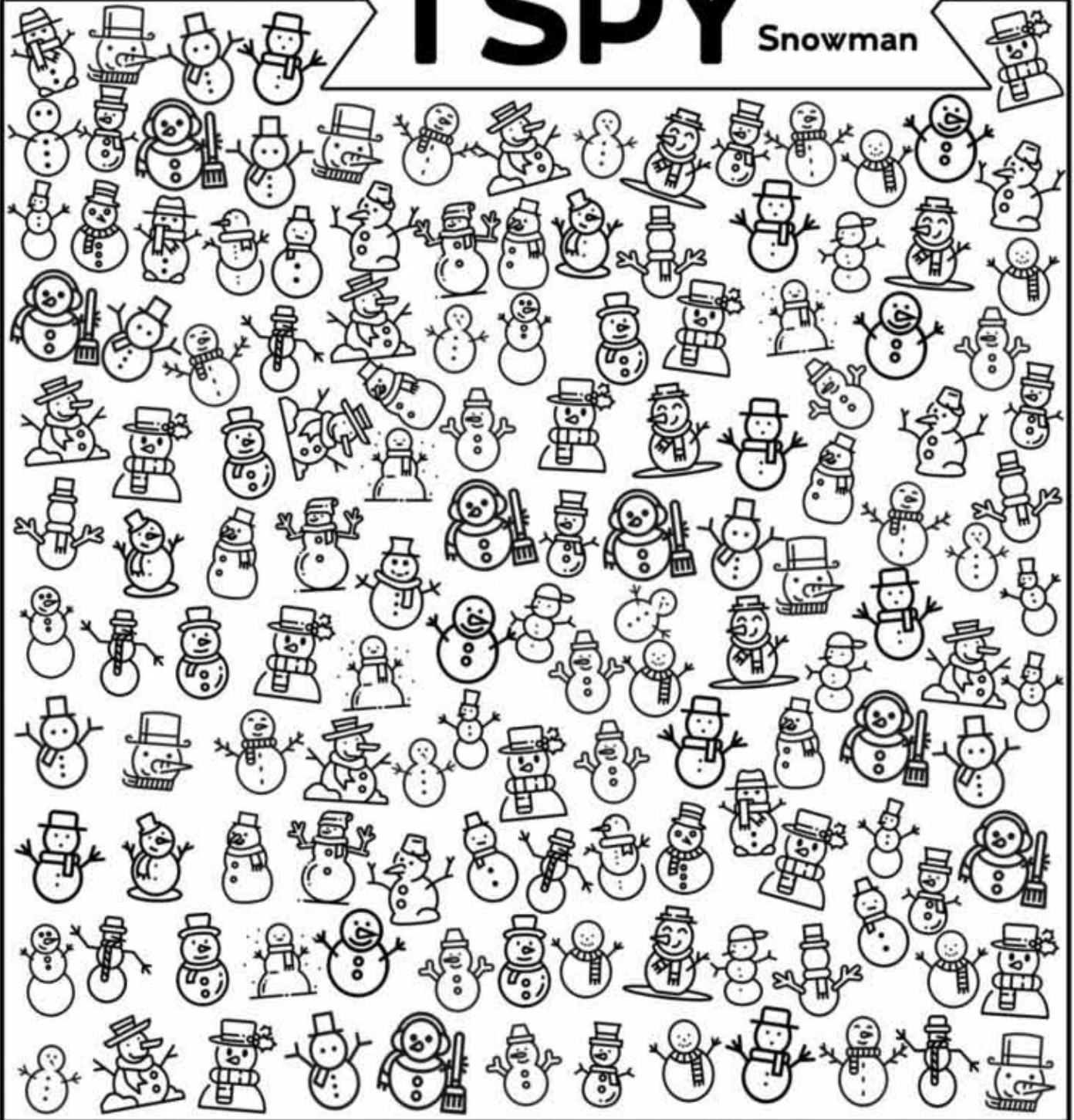

Property Tax Deductions

A deduction of \$250 is available to those residents age 65 years of age or older, who have owned their homes since October first of the previous tax year, lived in the state for two years and whose income (excluding Social Security or other similar government pension) does not exceed \$10,000.
