Property Tax Deductions

A deduction of \$250 is available to those residents age 65 years of age or older, who have owned their homes since October first of the previous tax year, lived in the state for two years and whose income (excluding Social Security or other similar government pension) does not exceed \$10,000. For additional information, call your local Tax Assessor's Office.

Cleanout & Move-out Fees

Contents from entire cleanout of dwellings cannot be put at curb until a fee of \$250 is paid to the Township of Berkeley and arrangements for collection have been made with the Department of Public Works. Mattresses must be enclosed in bags.

Garbage and trash are NOT to be placed at curb prior to 4:00 PM the night before pickup.

Rude and disrespectful behavior towards anyone in the clubhouse and/or on our grounds will not be tolerated, in any form. It is embarrassing to me that I even have to bring this subject to light.

By the time you read this, you have received a ROBO call that the Sentinel will no longer be mailed to your residence. The Sentinel can be picked up in the lobby of the clubhouse from Monday Through Friday 10am to 2pm. A brochure box will be outside the main entrance to allow residents to pick up a copy of the Sentinel after hours. This change has occurred because the Board of Trustees voted to turn down the unfair contract the publisher presented to us. As explained in my April President's Message, the publishing firm was cutting our monthly financial return from advertisements by over 50%, but increasing the number of advertisements published monthly. Additionally, they wanted to hold us hostage to a three-year contract. We will be exploring other opportunities to establish home deliveries in the future.

We are still looking for creative activities to attract residents to participate in the Association. I am open to realistic ideas from the community. I look forward to hearing some creative ideas. Thank you for your continued cooperation and support. If you need any help or assistance, please feel free to reach out to any of the Board of Trustee members or myself.

Dues Assessments

Second quarter dues payment of 2026 are due April 1, 2026. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the 1st of the next month if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. **Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.**

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

Dues Coupons

January 1, 2026 homeowners dues are \$72 per quarter per living unit. Payments are to be made at the beginning of the quarter. January 1, 2026, April 1, 2026, July 1, 2026 and October 1, 2026. If you pay semi annually the payment would be \$144 on January 1, 2026 and July 1, 2026. Annual payments are \$288 due on January 1, 2026. Make checks payable to Silver Ridge Park West Homeowners Association and mail or drop off in the mail slot at the Clubhouse, 145 Westbrook Dr., Toms River, N.J. 08757

Note: All payments must be accompanied by a fully completed dues coupon. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the first of the next month after the due date if dues are not paid on time.

Plastic Spoon Bug Craft

This plastic spoon bug craft is SO CUTE! Re-purpose plastic spoons from your recycling to make these adorable plastic spoon bugs.

Materials Needed

- Plastic spoon(s)
- Multi-surface acrylic paint
- Black pom pom (1 inch)
- Googly eyes (6mm)

Equipment Needed

- Scissors
- Paintbrush
- Glue gun



Instructions

Cut and paint the spoons. Cut the handles off of 3 plastic spoons. Recycle the handles and keep the rounded spoon parts. Paint the back of one of your spoons with black paint. This will be the body of the ladybug. Paint the other 2 spoons red. Allow to dry. Use a small paintbrush (or the end of a paintbrush handle) to add small black dots to the red spoons. These will be the ladybug's wings. Allow to dry.

Connect the ladybug pieces. Add a generous amount of hot glue to the cut end of the black spoon on one side. Plastic Spoon Bug Craft Place one of the wings into the glue, angling it out away from the body a bit. Make sure your spoons are all facing the same direction (the cut ends on the same side).

Add more glue, partially on top of the first wing. Set the second wing in place so that it slightly overlaps the first and goes out at the opposite angle.

Attach the ladybug's face. Cut a small black pom pom in half. Add a generous amount of hot glue to the flat side of the pom pom. Place the glued pom pom at the front of the ladybug, on top of the wings, covering where the handles were cut off. Add hot glue to the googly eyes and press them onto the front of the pom pom head.

Your plastic spoon bug is complete!

Meeting Minutes

March 9, 2026

President: Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. Good evening, everyone. Would anyone please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pat Lima: Opening prayer

President: Thank You Pat

Secretary: Roll Call: President. Here. Vice President. Here. Secretary. Here. Section 5, Here. Section 6, Here, Section 7, Absent. Section 8, Here. Section 9, Here. Section 10, Here. Section 11, Here.

President: Okay, we have a quorum, thank you.

This meeting is being held in accordance with the Silver Ridge Park West Governing Documents and Roberts Rules of Order, 12th edition. This meeting was announced in the Sentinel, on the Silver Ridge Park West website, and it is posted on the front door.

Before I get started tonight, I just want to say this is a trustee business meeting. It is not an homeowners meeting. Every meeting so far since I've been president, I've been told that someone is going around the community recruiting people to come in here to disrupt the meeting. And every meeting someone tries to be disruptive. I've heard tonight that people are here to scream, yell and be disruptive. It's not happening, this is a board of trustees meeting. I will entertain questions on the bylaws at the end of the meeting. I will only accept questions about the bylaws. I won't address rumors. I'm not going to have anybody yelling, screaming at us, hooting and hollering. If it happens, the meeting will be adjourned immediately. There will be no discussion. I want to have a pleasant, professional, respectful meeting, because we have a lot of things for the board to address.

So first, since we didn't have a quorum at our January meeting, we need to approve the minutes. All in favor? 9 in favor, section 10 no vote. Motion to approve February minutes. All in favor? 9 yes, no vote section 10.

We had our electrical inspection after our water crisis. The inspector was here. I was here with the inspector and the contractor, and the contractor received a nice compliment from the inspector. He advised the contractor that it was one of the most professional jobs he's seen in a long time. So, we passed the inspection with absolutely no questions. The only thing that hasn't happened yet, we haven't had a chance to replace the hot water heater.

Is Denise Kalinowski here? You had a resident with you at the last meeting that was questioning the sign. Is she here? Yes. Okay. I took your advice, and Bob and a couple of residents investigated the sign. I've got some information for you. We had two contractors bid on the sign. We also had the sign company come out and check the sign. The sign company reported the wrong voltage was run to the sign, which caused it to short out. The first bid was from Ronco Electric for \$10,200. The second bid was another contractor for \$11,400. For some reason, the more expensive contractor was picked. Now, this is the situation. We do not have answers on what happened to the sign. Individuals in this room know what happened, but are not saying anything. There's nothing in writing from the previous administration regarding why the sign is not working. So, I'm going to take your advice, ma'am. I turned it over to the attorney. The attorney is going to institute an informal inquiry into the sign. I know there was a question about whether the president knew about it, I have a signed document that she approved a charge on the association credit card to pay the sign company. I thank Bob and a couple of residents that dug into it, to get us the information. So, thank you, ma'am, for bringing that up.

We have a legal situation. We are at a point, after the attorney talked to an investor, that he needs to get a decision from us on what we plan on doing as far as selling homes to people under 55. Currently, if an investor comes in here and they are a flipper, they can purchase the home. If an investor comes in here over 55, they're allowed to purchase the home. If an investor comes in here under 55, they're not allowed to buy the home unless they become an LLC. Meaning that our governing documents are restricting people because of age, which is against the law. Mary Barrett, the previous attorney over a year ago, strongly advised the previous president to amend the governing documents as soon as possible to revise age restriction to be clear and consistent with the law. She advised the association is in a precarious legal position regarding these issues, meaning that we're not following the law. A month later, the attorney sent out another email to the previous president and it stated, the association and its individual board members are at risk of substantial potential liability by not changing the documents. Nothing was done, nor were the board members or association advised

of the legal situation. Now, we have an investor who's under 55 who is going to challenge us. I need the board to vote whether they want to take on the challenge and fight it in court or just concede. The board is all in favor to concede.

I had a resident in my office talking to me the other day carrying a sidearm, concealed weapon. Nobody was being threatened. This is not a public building. It's a private building. So, what I need the board to vote on and decide whether they want to allow concealed weapons to be carried or not, in this building. If we're not going to allow weapons to be carried, we need to post signs that no weapons are allowed. The board is all in favor of no weapons.

Vice President: Under code enforcement, any violations that are found in a home before it closes will be brought to our attention. Corrections need to be made prior to sale or an agreement from the new buyer to become compliant.

Every even year, HOPA forms need to be completed. I know we harp on this, but we need to be at least 80% compliance. So, if you did not do it yet this year, it's 2026, a new HOPA form needs to be submitted.

New Facebook page, Silver Ridge Park West, that's it and it's strictly for information that you guys will need to go forward.

I was asked to investigate shredding, and it was \$850 for a two-hour window to bring somebody in. I know they have shredding at the Funeral Parlor on Mule, but the county is also offering it at 530 County Road on April 18th.

Next meeting, Janine, the president of Silver Ridge Park Westerly, will discuss the petition rally she started, regarding deed restrictions that pertain specifically to senior individual ownership. The bill allows for bypasses of individual senior associations, a federally protected class, a protection that provides unique privileges and allowances in home ownership. The proposed legislation will impose fines on homeowner associations for upholding these property transfer conditions. Such fines could have a direct impact on how associations manage property transfers, enforce their bylaws, and jeopardize fiduciary fidelity of shareholders' operational costs, potentially affecting both the homeowners and the value of their investment.

Secretary: I want to make it very clear, If I do not have your blurbs or your flyers by the ninth of the month, they will not be published in the Sentinel. They gave us strict deadlines when I must have all the paperwork put into them.

President: Everybody has a copy of the balance sheet. We're doing great in dues collection. We're up to over \$200,000 for dues. We are going to be opening another reserve account, because we have over \$250,000 in the TD account. Also, the onetime capital contribution at the closing of homes is going into repair and replace. It belongs in the reserve account. Can I have a motion to accept the financials. Financials accepted. Ruth has been very persistent in collecting dues. She's collected almost \$20,000 in outstanding dues. We have 16 living units that we're going to place liens on. The total dues owed to us of the 16 homes is \$54,209.

Trustee reports:

Brian: I've had some residents call and wanted our grounds people to come and take branches out of their yard.

Marybeth: Just questions about snow clearing and a couple in my section wanted to know about Clubhouse and the AARP tax program. And I was able to let them know.

Bob: Nothing.

Shirleyan: There were a lot of calls and concerns when we were going through the storms

Tom: I had a question about the branches. How does that work? Especially common grounds, after the storms. Can residents put them out at the curb? Will they pick it up? Because I thought it had to be in a can.

President: If you put branches and stuff out on the curb, and advise the township to ask for a cleanup, they'll come out. They will give you a date when they'll be there and they'll pick it up. I have about 51 sites to look at tomorrow. Trees and branches that are down.

John: In my area, I got a lot of calls from residents, I advise them basically just call the township

Architectural control. We have a flipper who completely ignored architectural control and did what he wanted. Did it without architectural control's approval. I spoke to his partner, who just happens to be his sister. He knew what he was doing. He did it on purpose. He told his sister and his partner to take care of it after the fact that everything was completed. And now they want to sell the house. So, I need permission from the board to turn this over to the attorney. Motion, please. All approved. Thank you.

I spoke about the By-laws every single meeting, since we took over, that the committee was working on combining the 2009-2019 bylaws. The 2009 bylaws were operational ones. 2019 was more administrative legal. And I understand about the 2019 bylaws

because that happened right around the time that Radburn switched from an act to a law. There's nothing in there that stops any type of spending. There's no control over spending. So, in the new bylaws that went out, there's control over spending. The president and vice president cannot spend over \$5,000 unless it's an emergency without the board's approval. Also, we must get three quotes or an explanation of why we couldn't get three quotes, which is not in our documents right now. If the bylaws pass, that will be one of the restrictions.

The Bylaw committee did an excellent job. Another thing, there was no clear definition of a resident. It said in, I think it was section 2.05, must be a permanent resident. Well, the new bylaws, if approved, will be very specific. It will follow New Jersey's law that a primary resident resides more than 50% in the community. You must provide documentation of your residency. There are paragraphs that have been changed because the 2019 bylaws conflicted with the Radburn law.

We have had four or five trustee openings consistently for many years. Right now, we have five openings and a treasurer position. That means almost 40% of our board is not full. The committee decided to split the community in half, even and odd. So, District 1 will be all the odd sections, which will have two trustees. District 2 will be even sections. Same scenario. And then a fifth person who would be a trustee at large who anybody can talk to and can help the other district trustees. The attorney reviewed the new proposed bylaws.

Resident: Good evening. I have a question on 2.07 where it says that the board can deposit the monies collected at closing. In the bylaws, it says it can go to repair & replace, or reserve.

President: That's correct.

Resident: That should go to reserves and not be used every day.

President: It's not used for every day. Repair & replace is not every day. So, you understand for the last year and a half, all the money from the one-time fee, has gone into repair & replace. We're going to open a new reserve account to take it out of there and put it where it belongs. So where do you get your operating money from? Our operating money comes from the dues. The dues account goes into the operating account.

Resident: All right. So, you're not going to put any money from the reserves into the operating account?

President: Absolutely not. It's in the Bylaws, if you read it, that specifically says it must go into reserve or go into repair and replace. There's a formula that we follow on how much money we need to put into reserve. But it can go into repair and replace.

Resident: And another question, what did the engineering report say we should have in reserves?

President: One million dollars. And that's what we're doing over 10 years. You put money in and take it out for repairs, and we're on track. Our accountant looks at that every year to make sure that we're on track. And we are. Okay.

Resident: Isn't there a way we could have just taken the other sections and spread them amongst these six people, rather than reduce it even further than six?

President: Our bylaws did not allow us to do that. To be a representative, a trustee had to be from that section. Just trying to figure a way to make more people vote than just three or five. It's something that the committee looked at and thought about. And we knew it was going to be pushed back. But it was the best thing that we could do.

Resident: So my question is, from our trustees that are here now that are present, are they going to be assigned these positions or are they going to be elected?

President: If the bylaws go through, it'll be a community vote. Any other questions?

Thank you. Can I have a motion to adjourn the meeting? All in favor? All right. Thank you very much. Have a nice night.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Control Committee is a standing committee and operates under the guidance of the SRPW HOA By-Laws, Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, and Rules and Regulations.

According to Article V, Section 1 of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions: No building or other structure, fence, wall, swimming pool or any other structure, either of a permanent or temporary character, shall be erected, moved on, installed, commenced or maintained, upon the properties nor shall any exterior addition to or alteration be made to any existing building or structure unless the plans and specifications thereof, showing the nature, kind, shape, height, materials and location of same, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony, as to exterior design, and location of surrounding structures and topography, by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association which shall consist of either (1) The Board of Trustees of the Association, or (2) a committee composed of not less than three (3) persons appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Association.

Process by the Committee Members:

1. Provide HOA paperwork and assist homeowner with preparation of same.
2. Do preliminary site survey and discuss with homeowner planned improvements.
3. Collect homeowner's completed paperwork.
4. Present paperwork to HOA officers for approval and be available to discuss with officers.
5. Collect officer's signatures for approval.
6. Provide homeowner with copies of approval to proceed.
7. Maintain contact with homeowner.
8. Resident to contact Architectural Control upon completion of job Review project upon completion.
9. Return completed paperwork to HOA office for the permanent files.
10. Maintain tracking worksheet with progress.

Violations of the HOA Covenants and Restrictions:

1. STOP WORK order to cease work in progress
2. Delay in approval of proposed work
3. Possible non-approval of proposed work
4. Fines by the HOA for non-compliance, not to exceed \$100 per violation
5. Fines by Berkeley Township for code violations

Berkeley Township Construction Permits

No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- » Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- » The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- » Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- » Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- » Never leave your grill unattended.
- » Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- » There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- » If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- » Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- » There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- » When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

If the flame **goes out**, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least **5 minutes** before re-lighting it.

- ! July is the peak month for grill fires.
- ! Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

Payment Assistance for Gas and Electric (PAGE) provides grants for overdue natural gas and electric bills for low- and moderate-income households. If you are income eligible for USF or HEAP, you must apply for those programs first before seeking supplemental assistance from PAGE. You can apply online at: www.sharesnation.org or call **1-866-657-4273** or email info@sharesnation.org for assistance.

Lifeline Utility Assistance Program helps income eligible senior citizens and the disabled with their electric and natural gas costs. Apply for Lifeline with the NJSAVE application at: www.aging.nj.gov or call **800-792-9745** for more information.

Winter Termination Program (WTP) protects certain categories of customers from disconnection of gas, electric, water and/or sewer service during the winter months of November 15 – March 15. Eligible customers include those who receive USF, HEAP, Lifeline, PAAD, Work First New Jersey/TANF, General Assistance (GA), SSI, or water assistance programs. Customers unable to pay due to circumstances beyond their control, may also request the protection WTP. To enroll, please call your utility company and request WTP protection. For more information, or to file a complaint, call the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities at **800-624-0241** or visit www.nj.gov/bpu.

If you are in danger of utility shut off, or if you are currently disconnected, apply for the programs above and inform your utility company immediately.
